



FROM OUR PASTOR

February 14th. Valentines' day. Ash Wednesday. And slipping through the cracks, was the news that the Cubs pitchers and catchers reported! Yes, baseball season is fast approaching, and pre-season games will be here before we know it.

A bit of research tells us that pitching is between 75% and 90% of the game of baseball. This doesn't dismiss the importance of hitting and fielding, but does suggest that it's pitching that wins games. And as a longtime Cubs fan, I can vouch for the importance of a strong pitching staff, because we're not used to having one! I mean we can score run after run, and sure enough we'll lose the game, because our pitchers fail and the other team scores more.

Now what's important, is to see that the pitchers and catchers always report to spring training first. Managers and teams know that if they're going to have a good pitching staff, then they'll need more practice than the rest of the players. Hitting and fielding skills are easier to hone than pitching, so pitchers have to practice more.

So, the question I have for us is 'are we fielders and hitters, or are we pitchers?' I mean does our faith need practicing like a pitcher, or are we comfortable with just fielding a couple of sermons and hitting a couple of prayers and we're good to go? We hear the phrase often, that we need to 'practice our faith', but what's that mean to the average Christian?

Well practicing our faith most often refers to the way we live out the call God places on our lives. We talk often, that Jesus showed us how to live, love, and serve during his earthly life, and that we are to emulate this in our own lives. This means that we are to carry our Christian faith out of the church and into the streets and we're commanded to do. That's why we end our services commissioning one another to go forth taking the gospel into the streets where it belongs.

But here's my question; how well are we prepared to take the gospel to the street, practicing our faith, if we haven't first practiced our faith in the church? In other words, the more we learn about Jesus in the church, the more we can act like Jesus in our streets, communities, and neighborhoods.

So, what am I sneaking up on? I'm trying politely to suggest that being in worship is the best way to grow closer to Jesus. Now hear me well! I'm not suggesting that we can't grow closer by reading our Bibles and praying at home, and for many of our shut-ins, that's all they have available, and I'm thrilled that they worship on their own. But what I am suggesting, is that when we gather with other sinners, all sharing together as we learn, pray, and worship, that even through osmosis, we're going to grow more completely than we can on our own.

I bring you all of this to suggest that if you're one of the many who join us online each week, that I wish you'd consider joining us in worship. Further, I'd like to suggest that for those who are 'regular' worshipers, that we make every effort to attend our special services. Keep in mind, that we call them 'special' for a reason. I write this on the heels of our Ash Wednesday service, where attendance was rather shy. And what has to be considered, is how important these services are to our understanding of the seasons of the church. Right now we're in the season of Lent, and before we know it, we'll be celebrating Easter. And in my mind, it's hard to truly appreciate what Jesus went through for us, if we miss the special services along the way. It's like that pitcher who tires in the 5th inning, and starts throwing walks and more hits. because they missed practice, and weren't prepared.

So, my prayer for all of us, is that when possible, that we practice our faith in the church, so that we can better practice it in the streets. My prayer is that we appreciate and support those who put so much into our special services, so that the rest of us might grow in our understanding and faith. My

prayer is that we might **all** practice our faith **as a faith community**, supporting one another, and growing stronger together. Remember; practice makes perfect!





ONE GREAT of SHARING OFFERING Sunday, March 10th Theme: "It's Time to Share the Light"

"You're here to be light, bringing out the God-colors in the world." This scripture from Matthew 5:14 invites us to 'Share the Light.'

On Easter Sunday in 1949, on nation-wide radio, Christians were challenged to donate one million dollars in one hour to help people devastated by the aftermath of World War II. Faithful Christians answered the challenge and the goal was met.

That was the beginning of the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering. This year marks the 75th Anniversary of its inception. Our world has changed since 1949, but human needs remain, OGHS continues to carry God's message of love and hope to people in crisis.

Since that first offering, OGHS has expanded its mission to support domestic and international development, fight poverty and its consequences, bring aid and relief to communities torn by war or ravages by national disaster, advocate and offer resettlement assistance for refugees and displaced persons, and combat injustice in its many forms. OGHS provided funding and hands-on assistance in collaboration with local and international partners.

Each year, the Offering is gathered by several denominations and Church World Service (CWS) under a single theme developed by the ecumenical OGHS Committee.
