#### FROM OUR PASTOR

How to Explain God was written by Danny Dutton, age 8, from Chula Vista, California, for his third-grade homework assignment

#### "Explain God".

"One of God's main jobs is making people. He makes them to replace the ones that die so there will be enough people to take care of things on earth. He doesn't make grown-ups, just babies. I think because they are smaller and easier to make. That way He doesn't have to take up His valuable time teaching them to talk and walk. He can just leave that to mothers and fathers.

"God's second most important job is listening to prayers. An awful lot of this goes on, since some people, like preachers and things, pray at times besides bedtime. God doesn't have time to listen to the radio or TV because of this. Because He hears everything, there must be a terrible lot of noise in His ears, unless He has thought of a way to turn it off. "God sees everything and hears everything and is everywhere which keeps Him pretty busy. So you shouldn't go wasting His time by going over your mom and dad's head asking for something they said you couldn't have.

"Atheists are people who don't believe in God. I don't think there are any in Chula Vista. At least there aren't any who come to our church.

"Jesus is God's Son. He used to do all the hard work like walking on water and performing miracles and trying to teach the people who didn't want to learn about God. They finally got tired of Him preaching to them and they crucified Him. But He was good and kind, like His Father and He told His Father that they didn't know what they were doing and to forgive them and God said O.K.

"His Dad (God) appreciated everything that He had done and all His hard work on earth so He told Him He didn't have to go out on the road anymore. He could stay in heaven. So He did. And now He helps

His Dad out by listening to prayers and seeing things which are important for God to take care of and which ones He can take care of Himself without having to bother God. Like a secretary, only more important.

"You can pray anytime you want and they are sure to help you because they got it worked out so one of them is on duty all the time.

"You should always go to Church on Sunday because it makes God happy, and if there's anybody you want to make happy, it's God. Don't skip church to do something you think will be more fun like going to the beach. This is wrong. And besides the sun doesn't come out at the beach until noon anyway.

"If you don't believe in God, besides being an atheist, you will be very lonely, because your parents can't go everywhere with you, like to camp, but God can. It is good to know He's around you when you're scared in the dark or when you can't swim and you get thrown into real deep water by big kids.

"But you shouldn't just always think of what God can do for you. I figure God put me here and He can take me back anytime He pleases.

And that's why I believe in God.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL**

It was moved and seconded to approve the consent agenda as submitted. Motion carried.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT**

Pastor David was unable to attend meeting.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Use of Sunday School Rooms: Building and Grounds committee has not had a chance to proceed with a recommendation. There was discussion of a broken window in the first room downstairs on the alley side as well as up in the Fellowship Hall on the alley side. Discussion about Scout storage practices.

**Confirmation:** This is still on hold awaiting a new pastor for guidance and curriculum.

Hoefer Memorial Tree: Waiting until spring.

Special Congregational Meeting: There is no longer a need for the meeting as the Pastoral Candidate has accepted a position at another church. The Search Committee was notified of the decision on Saturday. Pastor David has contacts for Pulpit Supply but has not proceeded, seeking approval from the Church Council to move forward. The Search Committee may reform depending on if members would like to continue on the committee. A Special Church Council meeting may need to be called depending on choices of the Search Committee. The current committee consists of

Troy Meinershagen, Verdeen Ingram, Donna Kessinger, Bill Gosda, Jr., Warren Goetsch and Silas Tockey. There was discussion on possibly remaking of the Search Committee. Chairman Goetsch has made contact with Rev. Kathy Lawes at the Illinois Conference Office to try to put together the next steps. There was also discussion on a part-time minister.

Computer for Financial Officer: We are waiting till books are closed for 2024 to have the "oil change" that RTech has suggested done to see if that speeds things up. If not, there is an extra computer upstairs for the Sound Desk that will be used.

2024 Treasurer's Books: The books will close at 12:00 noon on December 31, 2024.

Annual Congregational Meeting: The meeting date is set for Sunday, January 26, 2025 immediately following worship or the next Sunday in the event of bad weather.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Nominating Committee Appointment: The Nominating Committee consists of two (2) outgoing Church Council members and two (2) from the congregation. The 2 outgoing Church Council members will be Leland Semple and Dan Row. Several names were suggested for the 2 from the congregation. Leland Semple, Dan Row and Sanday Meinershagen leave the Church Council in 2025.

Communion Schedule: For December 24<sup>th</sup> Leland Semple and Dan Row were on the list, but Roger Michalsen and Silas Tockey were added. Sunday, January 5<sup>th</sup> Communion will be done by Kaye Wilmert and Keith Birnbaum. There was a discussion on Communion supplies.

Custodial Update: A cleaning service has been contacted by the Building and Grounds committee, estimate for services fits within the proposed budget for 2025, cleaning service is coming Wednesday, December 18<sup>th</sup> for ½ day of cleaning with potential of returning for a ½ day after Christmas. Starting 2025 cleaning service will come on a weekly basis for a temporary amount of time, current custodian is on maternity leave.

**Drinking Fountains:** A question about the drinking fountains. The drinking fountains in Fellowship Hall are in need of repair. The one in basement has

been turned off due to concerns about respiratory issues.

**Kitchen Oven:** The oven was not working properly on Sunday, December 15<sup>th</sup> for the Christmas Dinner. There are issues with the left side oven is not heating properly, stove is between 30-40 years old.

**Email security concerns:** Regarding emails to all church participants, members would like their email addresses hidden.

**Photographs:** Additional concerns about perceived violations of privacy in photographs. **New member packet:** It's in the works.







